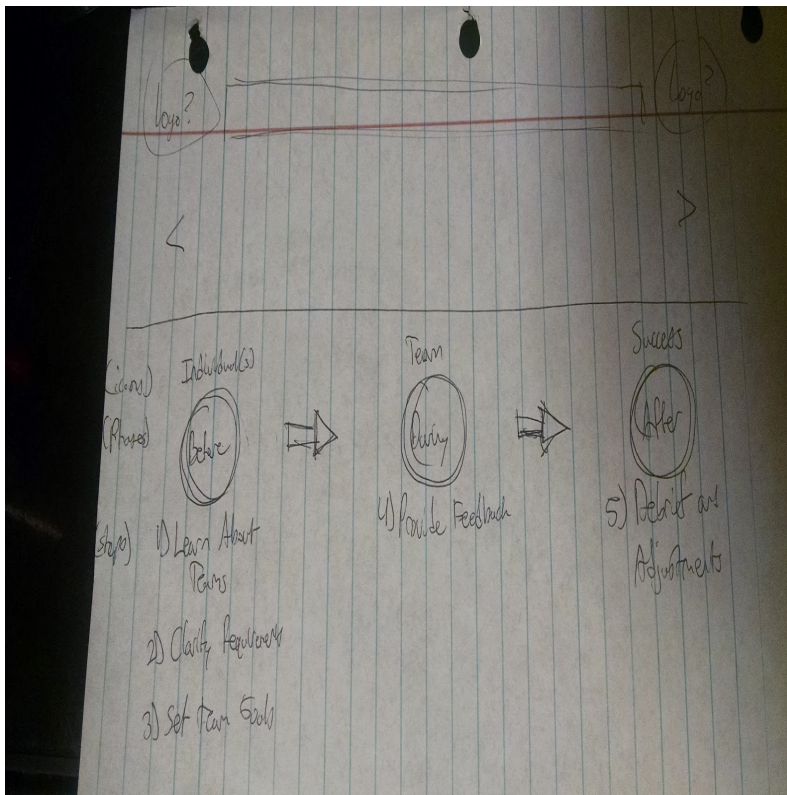

Your students won't spend a lot of time outside of class discussing teamwork – we recommend that your students spend less than 1 hour outside of class, spread over the course of the semester, discussing team performance.

Anyone can do it – it doesn't matter whether you teach business or biology, mathematics or history, these tools work in any classroom situation.
